What vaccines may be recommended based on your lifestyle

Adults are recommended to receive the following vaccines, though your PCP may recommend additional immunizations depending on travel habits, lifestyle, or medical conditions:



- COVID-19 vaccine
- · An annual influenza (flu) vaccine
- Tetanus (td or tdp) at least every 10 years

Adults may be recommended the following vaccines based on their age:

- Shingles vaccine (aged 50 and older)
- Pneumococcal vaccine (aged 50 and older)
- · Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccine

How your PCP can help you stay healthy

Not everyone's vaccination needs are the same. Your PCP can help you set up a vaccination schedule based on your specific health needs and risk factors, including:



- Age
- Health conditions, such as heart disease, Diabetes, lung disease, or a weakened immune system
- Profession, such as being a health care worker
- Recent or upcoming international travel
